Back to School Implementation Support



The start of the new academic year has arrived, a time when teachers, coaches, and administrators look for key resources to support district initiatives and learning for all students. Tips for SpringBoard teachers and coaches are below, and support for administrators is located in the second column.

Instructional Tips:

- The ELA section of the SpringBoard Community has been streamlined. Sub sections for all ELA courses are available and state specific resources have been marked for ease of use. Curriculum maps, standards information, state specific spaces, professional learning, and ELA news are readily accessible. Using the search feature will help users find previous posts and resources to begin the school year.
- [Administrator resources](#) located on the SpringBoard Community can be used by teachers and coaches to support the work in the classroom and provide insight into the design of the SpringBoard materials.
- The Implementation Support space of the SpringBoard Community has a Building Capacity subspace that contains the Promising Practices Leadership Video Series. The topics selected are critical to the implementation process and the accompanying one-pagers summarizes key points.

SpringBoard is excited to highlight implementation support opportunities for administrators:

- [Implementation Walks](#): This service introduces administrators to the [Foundational Classroom Observables](#) that can be used during their own instructional rounds. Data is gathered on foundational elements of SpringBoard implementation, the process of classroom walkthroughs is reinforced, and next steps for implementation support are identified.
- [Learning Walks](#): In this service, instructional leaders and administrators visit classrooms with a focus on providing feedback on the instruction observed. The team utilizes a protocol for crafting reflective feedback questions to share with teachers.
- [Building Expertise Administrator Workshops](#): These workshops are designed as a follow up to the Building the Foundation Administrator Workshop. Districts may select two to four modules from the following topics: Leading Differentiation Through SpringBoard, Observing SpringBoard Instruction, Supporting English Learners in SpringBoard, and SpringBoard and the SAT.
- [Digital Administrator Workshops](#): Administrators will engage in interactive digital sessions that help align their use of SpringBoard with school, district, and state expectations for instruction. These workshops launch on SBD in the fall.
- [Implementation Checklist](#): The bottom half of this document contains steps site leaders can take throughout the year to support their teachers and instruction with SpringBoard.

Encouraging Academic Discourse

English Language Learners need to engage in academic discourse to support language acquisition and learning of content.

The Discourse Starters graphic organizer promotes academic conversations by providing patterned expressions often used in academic discourse allowing students to focus on the task. Instructional Tip: Using one rich text, consider focusing on one or two sections to help students practice the skill of discussing a text, or summarizing a text, to build meaning. This scaffold helps to alleviate some of the challenge of impromptu class discussions and students can take ownership of the discussion when interacting with peers.

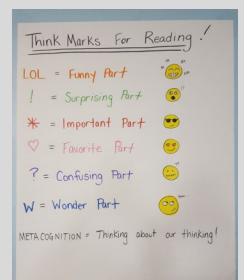
Parent Letters are Live!

The start of the school year brings many opportunities to connect to students and their families. The parent letters in the Teacher Resources tab allows teachers to communicate the work students are engaging in the classroom. The letters are available in Word format, so teachers are able to adjust the letter to include all instructional choices. The letter templates have also been translated into Spanish.

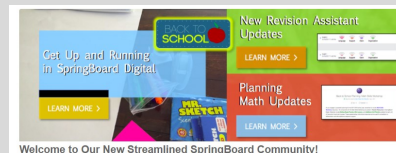

Differentiation

Fostering Differentiation through Professional Learning Communities

Engaging in the Professional Learning Communities (PLC) is a powerful strategy leaders can utilize to facilitate learning of educators who serve diverse learners.

According to Dufour and Marzano (2011), there are three big ideas that drive the PLC process:

- The fundamental purpose of school is to ensure that all students learn at high levels.
- Educators help all students learn.
- Educators must be driven by results in order to know if students are learning and respond appropriately to their needs.

Establishing PLCs is one way to support how teachers use SpringBoard. Focusing teacher discussions around formative assessments results can help to address the three big ideas mentioned above. These formative assessment opportunities are embedded throughout SpringBoard's instructional materials, giving teachers and site leaders continuous feedback on instruction. For ELA, having teachers use the writing to sources prompt towards the end of an activity can serve as a formative assessment opportunity to be analyzed within a PLC. In Math, teachers can analyze the responses to the debriefing questions that address the critical math for a lesson. **Check out the rest of this [blog post](#) on the SpringBoard Community!**



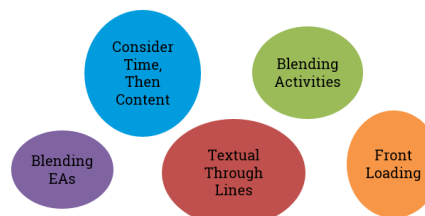
